OLD BUSINESS

Jayne Bell gave an update on the security camera issue from last year.

- Quick summary it is cost prohibitive. Initial installation and ongoing maintenance is expensive.
- Lots of issues surrounding a security camera
 - It opens pandora's box
 - Privacy issue.
 - Where is it stored?
 - Who is responsible for the footage?
 - Person who was going to take the lead last year never followed up.
 - Kathy and Abdi are not interested in serving on the board if there is a security camera added.
- Betty Woo mentioned Ring doorbell. Why do we need a neighborhood camera?

Snow plow – Betty wondered if we buy a snow plow for the neighborhood.

New home construction next to Kathy's house.

NEW BUSINESS

Roger Hockett – two new business issues.

- 1. Please sweep your sidewalks in front of your homes.
- 2. During snowstorm, and having lived here since 1994, Roger wondered if anyone else would like to have a camera at the bottom of the hill at SE 79th. He posted this on NextDoor and those that responded showed a lot of interest. Roger started doing some research on camera options.
 - a. Quick summary: it's not just snow, it's ice.
 - b. A while ago, there was talk of a lightswitch (green = all clear; red = don't go down) at the top and bottom of the hill. Haha.
 - c. Spoke to someone at city (Cary Sullivan design engineer for the City of Newcastle). No problem for permitting.
 - d. Spoke to Amber Elam from China Creek HOA. She is interested in helping. China Creek HOA board is meeting later this month and then the whole membership meets later.
 - e. Sharing costs among both HOAs. Total install of \$17,045 which equals \$28/member + \$5/member per year.
 - f. Set up is plug and play. Solar powered.
 - g. See spreadsheet for details.
 - h. Cameras have very good maintenance/warranty packages.

Is there any interest in pursuing it?

Someone asked if there was enough light? Low light? Roger answered that they are pretty good cameras. Answer is unclear.

A group of neighbors are against the camera install because there is a FB group titled "China Creek - - How's the hill?" Lots of opinions and discussion about it.

There is a legality with a camera. If there is an accident, there will be requests for the data on the camera. It is an extra hassle for the boards.

Abdi noted the City priority is to the clean the roads by 10:00am. Use common sense to stay off the roads otherwise.

Would the city be interested in placing the cameras around Newcastle?

In this room, how many people are generally interested in pursuing the topic? About half. It was determined that we will wait and see how the China Creek HOA board feels about pursing the camera. Someone (Roger?) is going to talk with the City of Newcastle about paying for it.
